

Three Bike Weekend

For a few years now, Ann and I have made a point of getting away for a weekend in early May. I think it started with the Ducati Owners Club weekend at Glenuig and since then it has usually been up the West coast and an occasional visit to the NW200. This year we rang the changes and headed for the Borders to stay in Peebles. For further variety, I decided I would take the Ducati and we set off smart on Friday morning. Only a mile from home everything died without warning complete electrical failure.

I coasted into a road-end thinking either a fuse had blown or perhaps a battery terminal had come adrift. Conveniently it only takes a second or two to un-bungie the luggage and lift the seat to get access to the fuse box. Everything seemed to be intact but turning on the ignition brought an audible buzzing sound from the general relay. No amount of tapping or plugging and unplugging would get it to switch properly, so jumping on Ann's Scrambler I went back to the shed to see if I had a spare relay in stock. I didn't but came back remarkably easy to hot-wire. Suddenly, one more turn of the key had all the idiot lights back on and an experimental poke of the starter button fired it up. Happy not to be pushing it home but still no wiser as to the real cause, meant I just rode home, pulled out the Commando and left the Monster on the naughty step.

Still feeling a little out of sorts, I tied my kitbag on the Norton seat (thats when I noticed I hadn't returned the Monster manual, but it was just going to have to come with us, as I wasn't going back again!) and we set off again.

One of the reasons we tend not to head South so much is that we have to get through the central belt before we get anywhere interesting. The Commando really is capable of just about any kind of riding, but the fast lane of a busy motorway is not its natural habitat but the quicker we can push through the traffic, the sooner the proper riding begins.
